Proposal for hiring summer seasonal firefighter

Board of Directors.

As you are all aware our Paid Call Staffing is very limited. Recruiting and retaining Paid Call staff has become a very challenging issue within the last couple of years. Training requirements set forth make it very difficult for non-career personnel to obtain the training just to meet the minimum requirements to respond on apparatus to emergency incidents.

In the past we have always relied on Paid Call staff to augment our staffing for out of county fire assignments. They have always made up the third staff on the apparatus to allow our response. With our current PCF staff, we have one qualified individual who meets the minimum requirements for wildland fire response.

Last year the district brought in \$530,958.59 in fire assignments.

I feel a third firefighter will be essential in ensuring we are able to respond to out of county fire assignments as well as enhance our staffing for local responses.

I am proposing for one firefighter, 12 hour shifts 4 days a week. Position will begin June 8,2025 and commence October 26,2025. It could possibly be extended one pay period if fire season dictates.

This position would be \$17.00 an hour.

Costs would be \$17,136 for hourly pay plus an additional \$1,991.20 if the hired employee is a PERS member. Total cost for the district equals. \$19,172.20.

I would further like to propose that the current firefighters receive a \$1 an hour pay raise from \$17.00 an hour to \$18.00 an hour. Cost to the fire district would be \$5,512 annually.

Thank you for your consideration on both of these matters.
