- 1. Discuss funding, contracting and reorganization of the fire district Discussed the potential cost and possible timeline for reorganization of the fire district. Fees to retain legal representation are proposed at \$1000/month and the timeline for reorganization is 6 months to one year. More money will be due to Nevada County based on the assessed valuation of the fire district. The Ad Hoc committee will inquire about anticipated costs of restructuring at the next meeting.
- 2. **ID Badges**

The Board would like Chief Rothenberger to pursue new ID badges even with restructuring.

3. Fire inspection violations in commercial parcels Due to the pending reorganization of the fire district, OHFPD will not pursue citing and billing or fining for violations and/or reinspections. The fire inspection program will continue to operate as it has been.

4. Legal correspondence regarding workers compensation Chief Rothenberger relays information from OHFPD's Attorney, Michael Colantuono. Any board member can sign the acknowledgement that Captain Nelson has his own representation and that OHFPD will not release information to Captain Nelson or to Athens Administrators regarding the claim.

 bring it to the next board meeting.
